### Work to create a safer, better-connected Waipawa main street is underway

Work to deliver a safer, better-connected Waipawa main street kicked off this week on Monday evening and will take six-to-eight weeks to complete.

The Streets for People project, which is 90 percent funded by NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi, delivers on the community's vision for Waipawa's main street, with trial solutions to help create safer and more people-friendly streets while recognising the town's historic character.

Tūpore Infrastructure will complete the works overnight, Sunday to Thursday, 7 pm-6 am, with a priority give way in place throughout the night and no planned works or detours during the day.

This project achieves what community has been calling for for many years and Council is committed

to delivering it efficiently and responsibly, with as minimal disruption to daily activities, road users and local retailers as possible.

Council will continue to keep the community well informed throughout the project and share details of how the community can feedback on the trial interventions once they are in place.

## A new weighbridge for Waipukurau

Central Hawke's Bay is set to take another step forward in its commitment to managing waste and its environmental impacts with the construction of a new purpose-built weighbridge at Waipukurau transfer station, which is 92 percent funded by the Ministry of Environment.

Construction is planned to begin on site on Monday 6 May and continue through to the end of June. During this time, we ask that users take care accessing the transfer station and be considerate to contractors and transfer station staff as they continue their work on site.

To allow for installation of the weighbridge, Waipukurau transfer station will be closed for three weeks between Monday 3 June to Friday 21 June. During this time, Waipawa transfer station will be open 9 am to 4.30 pm, seven days a week.

The new weighbridge will not affect the pricing of waste disposal at this stage but improve Council's waste data collection (amounts/types of waste the district is producing) and ability to track and measure waste diversion. It will also help us to shape effective waste minimisation initiatives and ensure future generations THRIVE here.
