SAVING H₂O IS THE WAY TO GO



With lower than normal rainfall during the spring the river and aquifer levels in Central Hawke's Bay are lower than normal. As the heat ramps up and we all reach for the hose, sprinkler and tap this will put additional pressure on the rivers and aquifers. But if we are careful with our water, there'll be enough for everyone.

Heading away – Turn your toby off!

If you are away from your property turn off your water supply at the toby or meter. A leak when you are not there could cause damage to your property, waste a significant amount of water and, if you have a meter, may result in an account.

Try these handy tips to look after our precious resource:

- Change the setting on your washing machine and dishwasher to 'eco', if possible.
- Don't run your dishwasher or washing machine until you have a full load. The 'half-load' setting uses much more than half the water and energy of a full load.
- Turn the shower on only when you're ready to get in.
- Turn off the tap while you brush your teeth or shave.
- Instead of running water while you wash dishes or veggies, part-fill the kitchen sink
- Water plants early in the morning to reduce evaporation.
- Water deeply twice a week, and for no more than 30 minutes, to toughen plants and encourage their roots to grow deeper.

Visiting or Camping at one of our Great Coastal Locations?



What a great opportunity to visit the ocean and so many beaches.

During the summer season the beaches can become quite busy. Everyone wants to have a good time, so please practice the Tiaki Promise to help ensure that everyone has a safe and enjoyable summer season

Be prepared: Bring your own water.

Safe drinking water (potable) water is not available at most public beach sites. Remember to protect yourself from the sun.

Drive carefully: Keep speeds down on roads and beaches. Remember, road rules apply on the beach.

Keep NZ clean: Please take your rubbish home with you or use receptacles for rubbish and recycling if provided.

Protect Nature: Use the access ways to the beach. Stay off of the dunes and do not drive on the reefs. Conserve water – there are scarce amounts.

Show Respect: Be kind, helpful, and considerate.

Download the CHB District Libraries App. The app is designed so you can manage your loans, place books on hold and so much more from your mobile device wherever you are over summer.






Snap Send Solve

Snap Send Solve is a smartphone app to help make reporting issues easy. Free to download from the App Store and Google Play, Snap Send Solve is a platform that eliminates the complexity of knowing where and how to report incidents on the spot. All our residents are encouraged to report issues with trees, footpaths, graffiti, dumped rubbish, water faults or any areas of concern in the local community via the application.

The Snap Send Solve app works by identifying the location the photo is taken using the phone's GPS data. It sends an email to the Council from your email address, including the incident type, notes, address of incident, photo, and contact details.
