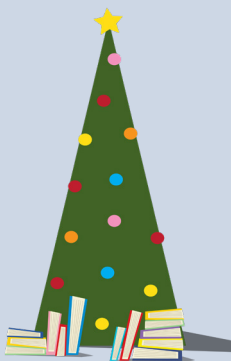
LOCAL LIBRARIES SUPPORTING OUR LOCAL COMMUNITIES
