Central Hawke's Bay: Tastes like summer!

Central Hawke's Bay is open and perfect for summer road trips or weekend getaways. Become a tourist in your own district. There is plenty to discover and do! Pick a day and an itinerary below and taste summer in Central Hawke's Bay.

Tukituki Trails

Stop for coffee and a bite to eat in Waipawa, then cycle or walk the Tukituki trails. Grab an ice cream in Waipukurau and if you are looking for an adrenaline rush, have a go at mountain biking up the Gumtree Farm Track.

Central Hawke's Bay Beaches

Take the trip from country to coast to swim, surf or relax at Te Paerahi (Pōrangahau), Blackhead, Pourerere, Kairakau, Mangakuri, Whangaehu and Aramoana beaches.

Explore Te Angiangi marine reserve in Shoal Bay, it's perfect for little ones to master their snorkelling skills and learn about life under the water's surface. Don't let the idea of sand be a barrier, hire the all-terrain/beach wheelchair so everyone can be included on this special adventure. Conserve Water

If you are heading away, it's a good idea to turn off your water supply at your property's toby or meter. A leak when you are not there could cause damage to your property, waste water and, result in a bill if you exceed your annual allowance.

Top five water conservation tips:

- Change the setting on your washing machine and dishwasher to 'eco'.
- Turn the shower on only when you're ready to get in.
- Turn off the tap while you brush your teeth or shave.
- Water plants early in the morning to reduce evaporation.
- Water deeply twice a week and for no more than 30 minutes to toughen plants and encourage their roots to grow deeper.





NOTE: There is a TOTAL FIRE BAN on all beaches in Central Hawke's Bay all year around – Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ).

Camping and Freedom Camping

This table shows areas available for freedom camping. Freedom camping outside of the permitted area is self-contained only (Kairakau, Pourerere (Tommy Ireland Point) and Aramoana), but Te Paerahi does allow for tent camping at its freedom camping site. Several beach communities have private and Council-owned campgrounds that you can contact directly to book a site. Council does not need to be advised of your intention to camp (freedom or self-contained) with the exception of Pourerere Beach, where a permit is required during the holiday period 15 December 2023-9 February 2024.

Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw -Tamatea/Central Hawke's Bay

We want your views on whether we should introduce a bylaw to help manage freedom camping and ensure everyone, including visitors to Central Hawke's Bay, can enjoy our public spaces.

The draft bylaw sets out areas we propose to permit, restrict and prohibit freedom camping within the district to protect the environment, health and safety of residents and to ensure access to key public sites. There are some proposed changes around non-self-contained/tent camping and permitted areas that are different

to the current permissions granted for freedom camping.

Council has received funding from Ministry of Business and Environment (MBIE) to enable us to have friendly camping ambassadors out and about this summer

Their role will be to engage with members of the public in relation to freedom camping matters to ensure that both locals and visitors have a safe and enjoyable time camping in our district.

They will also be seeking your views around the proposed freedom camping bylaw for Tamatea/Central Hawke's Bay.
