The decision I wish the Council to seek is no change in current laws.

Our family have been custodians of this property for 90 years. The natural features of this privately owned farm have always been valued.

We have an extensive farming policy and these areas create shelter for stock in bad weather. The benefits to the natural areas by our farming practice is that weeds and grasses are kept at a level allowing seedlings to grow and thrive. Stock will naturally select pasture over bush for feed.

Andrew and I have invested yearly in Pest control. On our arrival in 2000 possums and wild cats were a major problem. We got together with the Regional Council and got rid of 2000 possums and 40 wild cats. The impact on our native areas was immediate. Bird life returned and the bush regenerated. We have maintained our pest control every year since including the spraying of weeds such as gorse and blackberry. We have done this solely for conservation as there is no financial gain to us.

With all that said, this property is privately owned and should be recognised as such. We are more than willing to work with the Council, as we have in the past, but we are unwilling to be dictated to by these poorly thought-out laws.

We know we are already protecting our privately owned natural areas and do not require any change to the current laws.
