Waka Kotahi safety improvements to Waipawa main street

Detour for northbound traffic

Waka Kotahi are putting a detour in place from Monday 11 September until Sunday 15 October for motorists travelling north through Waipawa. Raised safety crossings are being installed at the existing locations, near the Four Square and Cenotaph. At the same time, part of the stormwater network will be upgraded.

During the work, the northbound lane of State Highway 2 will be closed through Waipawa's main street, and traffic will be detoured through Kenilworth Street and right into Waverley Street before rejoining SH2.

The work follows community feedback to make the crossings safer and reduce speed, including a petition and community campaign.

Raised platforms are used nationally and can reduce deaths and serious injuries by up to 40 percent.
