Printed copies of the survey are also available at our Waipawa office and service centres.

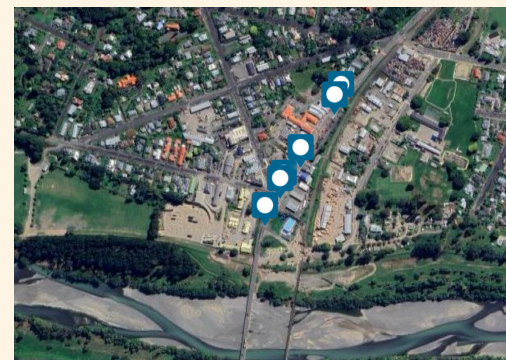
